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From the Pastor's Desk



FEBRUARY, 2025

[Jesus said] "Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life..." Mt. 6:25a NIV

The Rev. Dr. Terry Teykl is an ordained elder in The United Methodist Church and is a highly sought after teacher on prayer. Several years ago, he wrote, "Worry is active doubt in reverse of faith. When you worry you are actually meditating on the problem. Worry goes over and over every detail of our distress or need. Worry is a form of fear that will cause sleepless nights and dark days without much to smile about. Worst of all, it will keep you from the adventures God has planned for your life."

In Matthew 6:24-34 Jesus tells us to consider how God cares for the birds of the air and the lilies of the field, pointing out that if God so cares for these things, will not God also provide for our needs? Our heavenly Father knows exactly what we need, and he will help guide us into fulfilling those needs.

In an email article about worry, Teykl shares the following alternatives to worry:

- 1. "Cast all your anxiety on Him because He cares for you" (1 Peter 5:7). In other words, hand over your cares to the Lord. Let him have the load. If you trust God with your eternal salvation, doesn't it make sense that you can trust him with the burden you are carrying? It makes no sense to trust someone with your eternity and not trust him with daily cares.
- **2.** "Delight yourself in the Lord and he will give you the desires of your heart" (Psalms 37:4). Instead of making the problem your focus, determine to make God your enjoyment and delight.
- 3. "The Lord is near. Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything, by prayer and petition with thanksgiving, present your requests to God." (Phil. 4:6) Make a list of things you are thankful for and crowd worry out of your thoughts.
- **4.** Jesus said "My peace I give you....Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid" (John 14:27). You have a choice not to let...your heart be troubled or let yourself be afraid. Invite a peace take over. Relax and let Jesus reign.
- 5. "But seek first His kingdom and His righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well" (Matt. 6:33). Consider his bounty and meditate on his ability and his provision. When you remember all he has provided, your worries will pale in comparison.
- **6.** Pray, "Your kingdom come and your will be done on earth as it is in heaven" (Matt. 6:10). Ask yourself, "What will this worry mean in heaven now and later?"

Worry takes the focus off of God and places it on the problem. When we focus on the problem (or anything) rather than God, our lives get out of balance. When we seek Jesus first and the kingdom of God, then all of the other things do fall into order. It's when we lose sight of God and our purpose that life starts to get out of balance, and worry can creep in. These six verses and suggestions from Dr. Teykl are great ways of helping us turn our attention back to the proper order of things and a way to make room for the Holy Spirit to work in us and bring to us the peace of Christ that will dispel the worry.

I remember reading about one of the popes of the Roman Catholic Church and how he would deal with the worries that would try to keep him awake at night. When having trouble going to sleep because of the great responsibility he was feeling/carrying as the head of the Roman Catholic Church, he would simply envision God asking him, "Whose Church is it?" to which the Pope would respond, "Yours Lord." To which God would say, "Then let me take care of it." Then the Pope would drift off to sleep. I hope you and I will let our Savior take care of us by leaving our worries at the foot of the cross.

United Methodists in southern California are opening their doors and doing what they can to help people displaced by the Los Angeles wildfires.

- At the same time, many United Methodists are grieving the loss of their homes and at least two churches' buildings.
- At this point, people outside the affected areas are encouraged to pray and give money to what will be a very long recovery process.

As wind-blown wildfires ravage Los Angeles County, United Methodists are doing what they can to offer shelter and address immediate needs.

They are also starting to count their own losses — which include the destruction of church members' homes and the buildings of at least two United Methodist churches.

"I've never seen anything like it in my life, and I've been through two earthquakes and other fires," said the Rev. Garth Gilliam, superintendent of the California-Pacific Conference's North District. "I've never seen the vast scope of blocks and blocks of homes just gone."

Since Jan. 7, firefighters in southern California have been battling to control a series of major fires, fueled by dry conditions and fanned by ferocious Santa Ana winds. They include the Palisades firestorm close to the California coast, the Eaton fire north of Pasadena, the Hurst fire in the San Fernando Valley and the Sunset fire in Hollywood Hills.

The flames already have consumed thousands of structures across more than 50 square miles. Roughly 400,000 California customers have experienced power outages, and more than 180,000 people have needed to evacuate. At least 10 people have died. New conflagrations are still igniting. Meanwhile, the California-Pacific Conference — which encompasses United Methodist churches and ministries in the region — is already feeling the impact of the blaze.

On Jan. 8, flames engulfed the buildings of both Altadena United Methodist Church, north of Pasadena, and Community United Methodist Church of Pacific Palisades. At least five other United Methodist churches also were under evacuation orders.

The Rev. John Shaver of Community United Methodist and the Rev. Paige Eaves, the assistant to the bishop, have both lost their homes, the conference reported in its Jan. 9 update. Conference leaders expect many more church members also have lost their homes.

The conference also said that Church of the Foothills in Duarte and other church buildings have sustained damage from the strong winds. Los Angeles meteorologists have measured wind gusts up to 75 miles per hour this week. That's the strength of a Category 1 hurricane.

Bishop Dottie Escobedo-Frank, who leads the conference, has been offering daily updates and sharing her prayers.

"I am praying for you, bringing you before God, our Creator, saying, 'I know who you are. ... The United Methodists are people who do the work during times like this and care for each other," Escobedo-Frank said in a Jan. 8 video message.

"So don't give up. Go ahead and grieve. Feel all the feels. And then continue to do the work of sharing meals, opening homes and being Christ's avenue of love in this day."






